The President's Report

Academic Development

Distance teaching at the Open University is based on study materials developed specifically for this purpose. The Academic Committee determines development policy and decides on development of courses, programs of study and other academic projects. Most courses are based primarily on printed material developed during a lengthy process. Open University faculty in the field as well as those with knowledge and experience in preparing self-study materials are involved in the development process, together with experts from other universities.

The Open University currently offers about 600 courses in a wide range of fields. The University's prestige is based primarily on its excellent textbooks, used by students and lecturers at all universities in Israel. The study units, readers, books and study guides are written with the student in mind and most are intended for self-study. To ensure that OU books remain up-to-date and to maintain their high academic quality, OU management has decided to prioritize the rewriting of old courses and invests efforts to this end.

The Russian-Language Academic Program of the Open University

This year, translation of the course "The Archeology of Ancient Israel in the Biblical Period" was completed, and three additional courses have been developed and are being printed. This completes the development of 22 of the 24 courses in the program toward a BA in Russian. Development of the two remaining courses will be completed by Spring 2007.

English as a Foreign Language

Work continues toward reducing the number of tracks in A-level courses. In the Social Sciences, which include tracks in Sociology, Political Science, Economics and Management, new materials were developed and piloted.
