
Employees

The Open University Workforce

The Open University workforce numbered 2,278 this past year, including 912 tutors, 1,412 women, and 866 men. Full-time positions (excluding tutoring positions) numbered 1,124.6.

Gender Equality

Gender equality has become the subject of discussion in many forums, and is addressed in Israel by various entities. In 2011, the CHE established a committee chaired by Prof. Rivka Carmi, President of Ben-Gurion University, in order to examine the status of female faculty members and to propose initiatives. One of the committee's recommendations was that a position be established for an advisor to the president for promoting the status of women at institutions of higher education, as have already been introduced at prestigious academic institutions abroad.

In most academic institutions in Israel, an Advisor to the President for Promoting Gender Equality has been appointed. Likewise, a Forum of Advisors to the University President has been established. The Forum meets in order to raise issues shared by universities within Israel and abroad.

In accordance with the CHE directive, Prof. Ruth Beyth-Marom was the first to fill this position. It is now held by Prof. Judith Gal-Ezer (who is also a member of the CHE), and the position has been made an integral part of the university's organizational structure.

The Advisor to the President for Promoting Gender Equality participates in various designated forums on the subject of gender and serves as the contact person for those dealing with the issue in government ministries, the CHE and the PBC.

Computerized Services

Tutor Assignment System

The module for tutoring session schedules has been added to the system, enabling course coordinators to view and adjust scheduling, and approve tutorial sessions.

The OUI won the data analytics award at this year's ITA **competition for computerization excellence** for the *Ma'ayan* system. The judges cited the project as "leading change manifested in adopting uniform organizational language, in improved information transparency, and in improving and accelerating decision making processes. A simple and easy user-interface has been created, making it possible for anyone to produce the information required."

Digital printing center

A new system improves the service for employees and makes the working processes more efficient.

Improvement of external network protection

The firewall, which provides initial network protection, has been upgraded in the external circle of the connection to the Internet. The upgrade allows for improvement in meeting heavy external attacks on OUI websites.

Educational software for information protection

Educational software has been developed which includes information on privacy for users. The educational software will be given to every new employee in the process of opening a user account.

Citrix environment

The assimilation of distance learning based on the infrastructure of Citrix environments in an advanced version has been completed, improving the response speed, and making management of authorization more efficient.
