

Academic Development



The Open University's textbooks are the core of its endeavors, and constitute the fundamental study material used by its students. Over the years, the OUI has thus become well known for these textbooks, which are widely used by students and lecturers at other academic institutes in Israel and by the knowledge-seeking general public. The OUI textbook in its classic form presents the study material in a didactic yet friendly manner, prompting a dialog with the student with the aid of discussions in the text, interim summaries of the content, assorted questions and answers, illustrations and other pedagogic aids. The textbooks prove themselves repeatedly as highly efficient alternatives to frontal lectures and lessons, lending renewed significance to the long held view by OUI students and teachers alike that "the book is the teacher".

In addition to the OUI's courses, other forms of courses have been developed over the years, as well as basic models for developing courses. Each model is based either on printed material (such as books especially written for the OUI, generally available books, anthologies) or on technological study methods (such as CDs, videotaped lectures, links to internet sites) or on a combination of different types of study material.

This year, as in recent years, the University has given high priority to updating and revising outdated courses. The OUI is vigorously engaged in this important task while continuing to develop new courses for both graduate and undergraduate studies, which are required for the new programs approved by the Council for Higher Education.

Moreover, the OUI continues uploading courseware and other study aids to the internet with a view of making them more accessible to students while at the same time reducing CD production and distribution costs.

Translating Courses into Arabic

During the academic year, 2007-2008, the Open University began to translate its courses into Arabic. It was decided that the first stage would include translation of three courses: "The Middle East between the World Wars", "Educational Psychology" and "Introduction to the Social Sciences". Leading Arab academics throughout Israel participated in the scientific editing of these translations. The translations were completed this year and the material is currently undergoing scientific and language editing before the provisional edition is issued.

Translation and Development of Courses in Russian

The last books of two courses in the Judaism and Israel Studies Program were published: "Jews in an Era of Transition" and "National Security and Democracy in Israel".

Development of English Comprehension Courses

In order to meet the demand for English studies through virtual synchronized tutoring, Levels C and D were offered this year to OUI students, and level A courses were available to students studying sciences and humanities. This is in addition to the existing courses, level E (the lowest level) and an English Bridging the Gap workshop.

Development of Videotaped Courses

This year Ofek Studios produced three videotaped courses ("Genetics for Students of Social Sciences and Humanities", "History of Western Music II" and "Data Mining"), study material for mathematic courses, a series of interviews with Darfur refugees who are in Israel, as part of the "Human Rights in International Relations" course, as well as a series of video clips to teach Arabic writing in the new course "Fundamentals of Literary Arabic".

Development of Educational Software

With the aid of research grants, a resource for learning English was developed, allowing personal adaptation for each user. This is an internet environment dedicated to helping the student in coping with reading academic texts in English, and also includes tools which enable the lecturer to assess the level of difficulty of the academic English text, and to create aid sheets to help the student with the text. In the psychology lab, a simulation of a maze was developed for the purpose of testing virtual reality. New chapters for the courseware "Financial Theory: Financial Management of Business Firms" were also developed this year.
