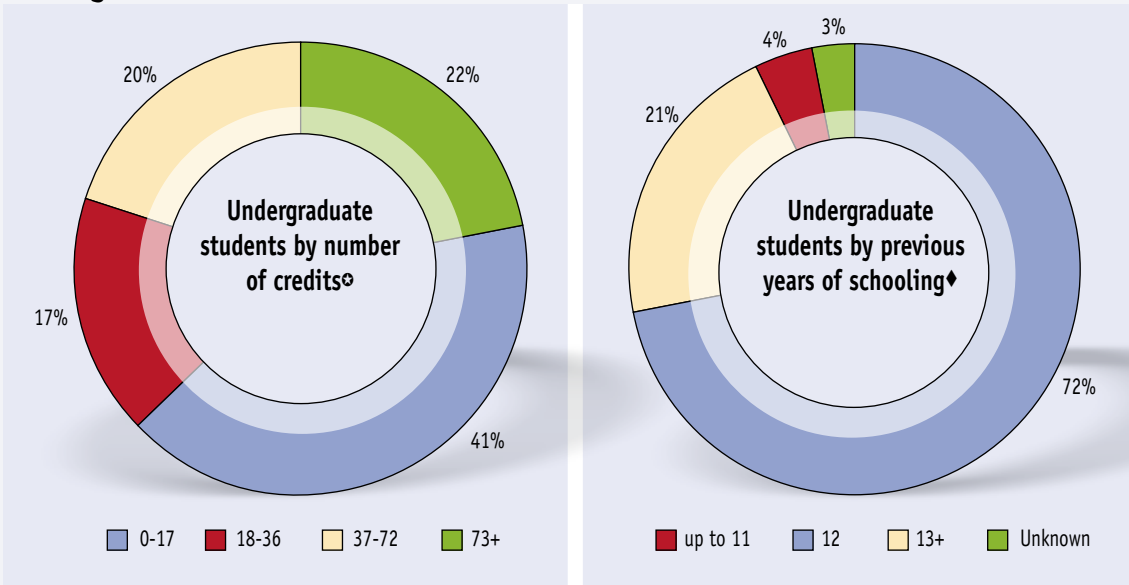


# Appendix B

## Enrollments and Students\*

### Undergraduate Students

This year, 42,386 students were enrolled in undergraduate courses. OUI students register each semester for a course (or some courses), rather than to departments. "Course enrollment" refers to a student registered for one academic course. Thus, one student taking two courses is listed as two course enrollments, but only one "student".

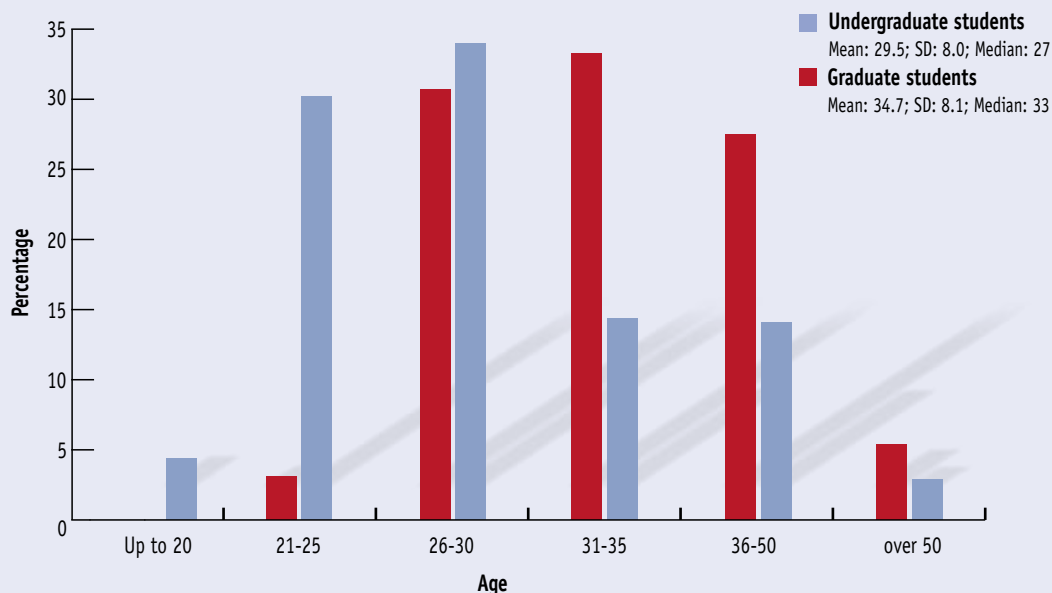
